SEM - I	CC1	Greek and Roman Historians	The Students will be able to learn about the writings of great Greek Historians like Herodotus, Thucydides and Roman historians like Pictor, Cato, Cicero, Livy, Tacitus etc. Also various political system and political wars are analysed in this section.
	CC2	Early Historic India (Proto-historic to 6 <sup>th</sup> Century B.C.	Students will acquire knowledge about the Indian History starting from Pre-historic times, sources of Ancient Indian History and Early civilizations like Mehargarh, the Harappan and the Vedic civilizations. They also will learn about religious life including religious protest movements like Buddhism, Jainism etc.
	GE1	Theories of the Modern State	From this segment of the syllabus students can learn about the theories of the formation of the modern state. They will learn about different thinkers like Hobbs, Hegel, Jean Bodin, John Locke, Bentham, John Stuart Mill, John Rawls etc.
SEM-II	CC3	Mauryan and Gupta Empire	This section explains the political system of the Mauryan and Gupta empire, the society, culture, religion of that time.
	CC4	Political History of Early Medieval India (600 – 1200 A.D.)	Students will learn about the early Medieval India, slight of political power and the dynasties of Chalukyas, Rashtrakutas and the Tripartite struggle in India
	GE2	Science and Empire	Students will understand the history and development of science under the colonial empire, the Institutions in promoting scientific knowledge like Medical College, Botanical Garden and the Resistance idea of Mahatma Gandhi.
SEM - III	CC5	Delhi Sultanate	This section of syllabus explains the establishment, expansions and consolidation of

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			the Delhi Sultanate under Iltutmish, Balban, Allauddin Khilji, Mahammed Bin Tughluq etc.
	CC6	The Feudal Society	The Students will learn about the formation of feudal society and economy, Muhammad and Charlemagne, Carolingian empire, religion and culture and emergence of national kingship
	CC7	Akbar and the Making of Mughal India	From this paper students will learn about the source of historiography and establishment of the Mughal rule in India under the reign of Akbar the great Mughal Emperor.
	GE3	Some Perspectives on Women's Rights in India	Students will be able to learn about the definition of Human Rights, Indian Constitution and Human Rights.
	SEC1	Literature and History : Bengal	Students will be able to know about the correlation of Literature and History with the many writings of Sarat Chandra Chattopadhyay, Rabindranath Tagore, Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyay etc.
SEM - IV	CC8	Renaissance and Reformation	This section of syllabus gives the idea of political system of early modern Europe, Italian Renaissance and Humanism, cultural revolutions like Printing Revolution, maritime voyages as economic activity, Scientific revolution and the rise and growth of European Reformation.
	CC9	The French Revolution and Napoleon Bonaparte	Students will acquire knowledge about the historiography of French Revolution, socio-economic conditions of France, the intellectual's role in French revolution and Napoleon Bonaparte.
	CC10	19 <sup>th</sup> Century Revolution in Europe	Students will be able to know about the revolutionary activities of the Greeks as well as the European countries. They can also learn social and economic revolutionary histories of Europe in

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			the 19 <sup>th</sup> century.
	GE4	History of Indian Journalism	In this paper the Students will learn how Indian journalism evolves in the colonial and post-colonial period with special reference to Hiki, Amritabazar Patrika, Hindustan Times etc.
	SEC2	The Making of Indian Foreign Policy	The students of History will learn from this paper about how the Indian foreign policy flourished under the reign of Jawaharlal Nehru.
SEM - V	CC11	Selected Themes in the Colonial Impact on Indian Economy and Society	This syllabus gives the knowledge of the Company's rule in India, its socio-economic impact, land revenue system and the reforms in socio-religious and educational fields.
	CC12	Peasant and Tribal Uprising in Colonial India in 19 <sup>th</sup> Century	This paper evolves the peasants and tribal movements in the early 19 <sup>th</sup> and late 19 <sup>th</sup> century against the colonial rule in India. Such as Ho, Kol, Munda, Santals, Kuch movements etc.
	DSE1	Modern Transformation of China	The students will learn about the history of transformation of China from 1839 to 1949, that is from pre-modern to modern period.
	DSE2	Modern Transformation of Japan	The students will learn about the history of transformation of Japan from Tokugawa Shogunate period to the Japanese participation in the World War II.
SEM - VI	CC13	International Relations after the Second World War	This paper evolves the trends of world politics after the Second World War. The students can learn the international relations of world politics since 1945.
	CC14	Modern Nationalism in India	The students will learn about the freedom movements, the role of many regional parties and the movement led by Mahatma Gandhi.
	DSE3	War and Diplomacy 1914-1945	This section of syllabus describes the social, political and economic scenarios of the world, the two World Wars and the after effects on the

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			people of colonial countries.
	DSE4	Pre-colonial South East Asia	The syllabus of this paper gives the knowledge of the socio-cultural affairs of the South-East Asian countries and also the history of the relations with the Indian sub-continent.
