SEM – I (Under CCFUP)	MJ101T	Ancient India from the Earliest Time to 600 B.C.	The Students will be able to learn about the Historical theories and interpretations on the Indian Past, Idea of Bharatabarsha and Literary and Archaeological sources. They will learn about different settlements of Indian sub-continent, Harappan civilization and the Aryans and the history of the Magadhian Empire of 6 th Century B.C. They will also acquire knowledge about social stratifications, cults, doctrines and metaphysics, aspects of economy till the age of Buddha
	SEC01P	Art Appreciation: An Introduction to Indian Art	Students will acquire knowledge about the Indian pre-historic and proto-historic art: rock art, Indian art (600 B.C. to 600 A.D.), world heritage sites, UNESCO listed sites, notion of art and craft of Indian paintings, major development in Stupa and Cave and temple art. They will learn about Indian Art during the age of Sultanate and Mughals. Also they learn modern and contemporary Indian art and architecture and regional and popular art forms.
	MI01T	Ancient India	From this segment of the syllabus students can learn about the Harappan Civilisation, Vedic Age, and State formation in early India, Mauryan Empire and Gupta Empire. They will get the idea of Early medieval India: formation of regional states.
SEM-II	MJ102T	Social Formations and Cultural Patterns of Ancient World	This section explains the evolution of humankind, Paleolithic and Mesolithic cultures of the history of the Ancient World. Also they can learn about the beginning of agriculture and animal husbandry. They will know about

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			different civilizations like Egypt, Mesopotamia and China, and eastern Mediterranean economy they will know about different nomadic groups in central and west Asia, slaves' society in Ancient Greece and polis in Ancient Greece.
	SEC02P	Archives and Museums in India	Students will learn about the definition and history of development, types of Archives and Museums, understanding the tradition of preservation in India, Collection policies, ethics and procedures collection, field excavation, purchase, gift and bequests, loan and deposits, exchanges, treasures trove, confiscation and others. They will know about documentation in accessioning, indexing, cataloguing, digital documentation and de-accessioning. They will also learn about the curatorial care, preventive conservation, chemical preservation and restoration. The syllabus also helps to learn about the activities of the Museums, Archives and Society.
	MI02T	Medieval India	Students will learn about the first Muslim penetration in India by the Arabs in Sind and its consequences. They will know the history of the later Muslim rulers in India, their consolidation in power by the sultans from Aibak to Firaz Shah Tughlaq, emergence of regional powers during the Sultans. They will also learn the history of the Mughal empire and the later Mughals, and the contemporary political, socio-economic and cultural phenomena and its impact on the Indian people. They will know about the religion life and its impact on the Indian society by the Bhakti and Sufi saints through their ideas. Such as Kabir, Nanak, Mira Bai, Shri Chaitanyadeb of the Bhakti movements and Mainuddin Chisti, Nijamuddin Aulia, Surabardi etc. of the Sufi movements.
